Looking for a fun craft for "Jesus preaches in the church...or other fun Bible lessons or props?

Gather some canvas fabric, old coffee, dowel rods and a glue gun and you're ready to go!

Purchase plain canvas by the yard (it's cheaper) depending on the number of children you have.

Spread your fabric on the ground or sidewalk and sprinkle hot coffee or hot tea onto the canvas. (Leave some areas untouched). Allow to dry completely.

I cut my fabric into 26" X 13 1/2 " strips and I used 17 1/2" dowel rods.

Take the two dowel rods and lay on each of the short sides of the scroll.

Run glue along both short sides of the canvas. Be liberal with the glue.

Place one dowel rod onto the glue and begin to wrap the canvas around the dowel rod. As soon as the dowel rod is covered with fabric, secure with more glue.

Allow the hot glue to cool completely.

Now start to roll both sides. When the two dowel rods meet in the middle, hold both sides firmly and wrap and ribbon around the scroll.

Tie in a bow and allow to dry. (Raffia or jute works well or some type of a ribbon with old looking beads at the ends would work well also.)

Give each child a marker and a Hebrew writing sheet.

Allow them to create their own scroll.

Have the children write the translation at the bottom in English (small)
