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He doesn't fit does He?
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
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160. DANIEL IN THE LION'S DEN (DANIEL 6:1-28)

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Gather a second container (paper plate) for each child.

In class

This jar represents your day. The rice represents the things you try to get

done in a day (i.e. shower, do your hair, do your chores, homework, school,

play with friends, activities)

The walnut represents God.

Pour your rice onto your paper plate.

Now, refill your jar with all of the things that you do during the day.

As you fill your jar, think about each of the things that you fill your day with.

(Once the jars are full)

**Say...Now put God
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**He doesn't fit does He?
We didn't leave enough time for God.**

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Pour your rice out once again.

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
