

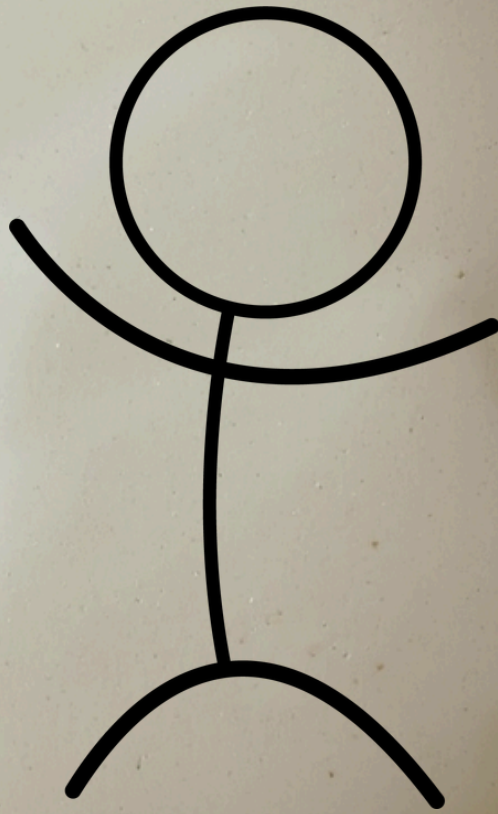
I GET DOWN



OBJECT LESSON

AND HE LIFTS ME UP

YOU WILL NEED



A GLASS PIE PAN OR PLATE
(FLAT BOTTOM)
A EXPO DRY ERASER MARKER
A GLASS OF WARM WATER

USE A EXPO DRY ERASER MARKER



DRAW A "SMALL" STICK FIGURE.
MAKE SURE THE LINES ARE SOLID
AND THE CIRCLE CONNECTED.

ALLOW TO DRY FOR A FEW SECONDS

VERY SLOWLY POUR **WARM** WATER
INTO THE PIE PAN.



THE STICK FIGURE WILL RELEASE FROM
THE BOTTOM OF THE PAN AND FLOAT
ON TOP OF THE WATER.

IF YOUR STICK FIGURE BREAKS APART, YOU ARE
POURING YOUR WATER TOO QUICKLY.

TIPS:

- USE **WARM** WATER
- POUR WATER **VERY** SLOWLY.
- DO NOT POUR THE WATER DIRECTLY ON TOP OF THE STICK FIGURE.
- YOU ONLY NEED A LITTLE **WARM** WATER. ENOUGH FOR THE FIGURE TO RELEASE AND DANCE FREELY FROM THE PAN.
- ONCE YOUR STICK FIGURE FLOATS, YOU CAN SLOWLY TIP THE PAN FROM SIDE TO SIDE TO MAKE IT DANCE.
- THIS TAKES A LITTLE PRACTICE, SO GIVE IT A TRY BEFORE TRYING IN CLASS. TRY DIFFERENT PANS TO SEE WHICH ONE WORKS BEST.
